15. Please name a modern day former U. S. President who best represents your political philosophy.

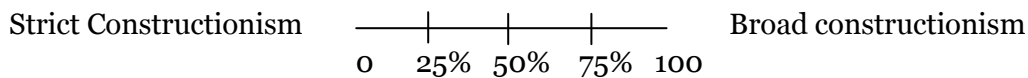
16. Please identify one Supreme Court decision in your opinion which most impacted American society. Please explain.

17. Should judicial decisions be guided by the Natural and Moral law informed by the teachings found in Holy Scripture or by positive law when conflicts arise between moral and positive law? (Positive law as defined as enacted law—the codes, statutes, and regulations applied and enforced in the courts.) Where do you stand within the scale below? Please explain.

19. Briefly list one or two political issues of most concern to you, and explain why each is important to you.

20. Where would you place yourself as a jurist on a scale between strict and broad constructionism? Please explain.



Definitions:

Strict Constructionism: Interpreting the U.S. Constitution based on a literal and narrow definition of the language without reference to the differences in conditions when the Constitution was written and modern conditions, inventions and societal changes.

Broad Constructionism: A broad interpretation of the U.S. Constitution legitimately influenced by the contemporary needs of the nation and the spirit of the times; "broad, and often vague language, of the U.S. Constitution requires governmental or judicial interpretation using the current facts and issues".
